# TREELINE CIRCUIT TOUR

**Allow: 6 – 8hrs / Tour usually start from 08:00am**

**The Treeline Circuit Tour** covers the central cluster of temples within the Angkor Park, what many view as the most popular or must-see temples, plus a few of our favourites!



**Angkor Wat** is one of the largest and most famous religious monuments in the world, featuring a spectacular moat that encloses the temple grounds with grand entrances and causeways leading to the massive multi-level, multi-towered ornate sandstone temple. It was built early 12<sup>th</sup> century, coming upto 1000 years old.

Angkor Thom translates to the “Great City”, it contains several of the must-see temples and ancient sites including **Bayon Temple** the richly decorated ancient Khmer temple located at the center of Angkor Thom famous for its array of towers with smiling faces. Banteay Kdei with its ruinous and majestic charm along with Terrace of the Elephants, Terrace of the Leper King, Baphoun Temple and others await you within the gates of Angkor Thom.



**Ta Phrom** is arguably the most famous temple aside from Angkor Wat, known as the jungle temple, made famous by the Hollywood blockbuster Tomb Raider being filmed there. However, what really makes it special is the amazing trees with their reptile-like roots overtaking the ancient temples remains, where art, architecture and nature truly meet.

**Preah Khan**, one of the largest and most grand ancient temples, built in the early 12<sup>th</sup> century. Not just a temple, from all indications the 56ha site was a royal city that once housed hundreds of buildings for monks, students and workers inside its outer enclosure wall, while the much smaller third enclosure contains the principal religious temple likely only accessed by royalty and their gurus it also encases a maze of chapels, courts, halls, and pavilions with a central shrine located on the north-south east-west axis. **Ta Phrom** is arguably the most famous temple aside from Angkor Wat, known as the jungle temple, made famous by the Hollywood blockbuster Tomb Raider being filmed there. However, what really makes it special is and the amazing trees with their reptile-like roots overtaking the ancient temples remains, where art and architecture truly meet.

Phnom Bakheng is also on the small circuit, the highest temple in the park and is well worth the short hike for a memorable sunset looking out over the vast green landscape.

# GRAND CIRCUIT TOUR

**Allow: 5 – 6hrs / Tour usually start from 08:00am**

**The Angkor Grand Circuit** navigates the outer temples of the central Angkor Park Complex. Covering the more less known of the temples and of course abit quieter than the other more well known temples.



The highlights of this circuit include **Preah Khan**, a large and grand ancient temple built in the early 12<sup>th</sup> century. Not just a temple, from all indications the 56ha site was a royal city that once housed hundreds of wooden buildings for monks, students, and workers inside its outer enclosure wall, while the much smaller third enclosure contains the principal religious temple likely only accessed by royalty and their gurus it also encases maze of chapels, courts, halls, and pavilions with a central shrine located on the north-south east-west axis.

**Neak Pean** is one of the most mysterious, and unique temples, of the Angkorian Empire. Built once again in early 12<sup>th</sup> century it is located on a man-made island at the center of a massive baray (lake), hidden amongst the dense woods is this very special Buddhist temple.

Other temples to note on this circuit are Eastern Mebon built in the 10<sup>th</sup> century and **Pre Rup** also dating back to 10<sup>th</sup> century a quincunx of towers rising from a pyramid base to form the "temple mountain", an architectural concept of the ancient Khmer to represent the sacred Mount Meru in Hindu beliefs. Ta Som has a similar charm to Ta Phrom only on a smaller scale with its jungle charm, beautiful gopura and smiling faces.

# BANTEAY SREI TEMPLE

# BENG MEALEA TEMPLE

**Allow: 3 – 4hrs / Tour usually start from 08:00am**

**Beng Mealea**, often called the "Jungle Temple," is an ancient, mysterious temple located about 40 kilometers east of the Angkor Wat complex in Cambodia. Built in the 12th century by King Suryavarman II, it is believed to share similar architectural elements with Angkor Wat, though it is unique in its own right.



Constructed mainly from sandstone, **Beng Mealea** is a sprawling complex measuring roughly one square kilometer, surrounded by a large moat. Unlike many other temples, it has not yet been fully restored, giving it an atmosphere of exploration and adventure, with crumbling structures, collapsed galleries, and massive trees and vines enveloping the stones. The jungle has taken over much of the temple, and visitors can see tree roots weaving through stone walls and moss covering surfaces, giving it an untouched and almost mystical feel. This is why it is one of our absolute favourites.

Despite its remote location and rugged terrain, **Beng Mealea** offers visitors a serene experience of exploring an ancient temple still entwined with nature, untouched by large crowds.

# KOH KER TEMPLE

**Allow: 5 – 6hrs / Tour usually start from 08:00am**

**Koh Ker**, a remote archaeological site in northern Cambodia, offers a captivating glimpse into the lesser-known history of the Khmer Empire. notable for its unique architecture and historical significance. It was the capital of the Khmer Empire under King Jayavarman IV during the 10th century, a period that saw the construction of over 180 impressive structures in the region.



Unlike Angkor, the temples at **Koh Ker** are more minimalist in style, with a striking pyramid-shaped temple called Prasat Thom at the center, which rises 36 meters high. This towering, seven-tiered structure is reminiscent of Mayan pyramids, an unusual design in Khmer architecture, making it stand out among Cambodia's ancient temples. The carvings and reliefs at Koh Ker, depicting scenes of Hindu deities and mythological figures, are masterfully executed and reflect the artistic spirit of the Khmer people at that time.



# KULEN MOUNTAIN

**Allow: 4 – 5hrs / Tour usually start from 08:00am**

**Kulen Mountain**, also known as Phnom Kulen, is a significant archaeological and religious site located in Cambodia. Kulen Mountain is a historic site where King Jayavarman II declared independence from Java in 802 AD, marking the beginning of the Khmer Empire. The mountain is covered with dense forests, and within its grounds are ancient temples, statues, and carvings that date back to the Angkorian era. One of the most notable features is the River of a Thousand Lingas, a sacred riverbed filled with carvings of lingas (symbols of the god Shiva) and other Hindu deities, symbolizing the sanctity of water and its role in fertility.



Besides its historical and religious significance, **Kulen Mountain** is also a popular destination for nature lovers. The area is dotted with beautiful waterfalls, the most famous of which is the Kulen Waterfall, where visitors can swim or relax in the cool, clear waters. The houses, elevated on wooden stilts, stand up to 10 meters above the ground, allowing villagers to continue their daily lives despite the seasonal floods. The village provides an immersive experience into Cambodia's rural life and local customs, where traditional fishing and farming are essential parts of the economy and lifestyle.



Visiting **Kampong Phluk** offers a glimpse into a different way of life, one strongly connected to nature and the rhythms of Tonle Sap Lake. The best time to visit is during the rainy season when the high waters transform the entire area into a serene waterway lined with mangrove forests. These mangroves are not only scenic but also serve as vital ecosystems for fish and other wildlife. A trip to Kampong Phluk offers a look at Cambodian culture and the resilience of a community that has adapted ingeniously to its environment, providing an unforgettable experience for those interested in authentic, off-the-beaten-path travel.

# KOMPONG KHLEANG

**Kompong Khleang** is an expansive and vibrant floating village located on the northeastern edge of Tonle Sap Lake. It offers visitors a glimpse into the traditional way of life of its residents. Known for its tranquil atmosphere, this village is a popular destination for those seeking to explore the beauty and diversity of Cambodia.



Composed primarily of stilt houses, Kompong Khleang is well-adapted to the fluctuating water levels of the Tonle Sap. When the rainy season arrives, water levels rise significantly, creating a floating effect where boats replace bicycles and villagers use waterways to move between homes. This seasonal transformation highlights the villagers' resilience and adaptation to their environment.

Tourists visiting Kampong Khleang are offered a unique insight into a traditional Cambodian lifestyle that revolves around fishing and small-scale farming. Unlike more commercialised floating villages, Kompong Khleang remains a working community with a rich cultural heritage. Visitors can observe everyday scenes like fish drying in the sun, crocodile farms and families paddling to markets. Surrounded by lush, flooded forests and rice paddies, Kampong Khleang provides a serene, picturesque setting and an authentic, less tourist-driven experience that reflects the harmony between the villagers and Tonle Sap Lake's natural rhythms.

# PREAH VIHEAR TEMPLE

**Allow: 6 – 7hrs / Tour usually start from 08:00am**

**Preah Vihear Temple** is a stunning ancient Khmer temple perched atop the Dângrêk Mountains on the border between Cambodia and Thailand. This **UNESCO World Heritage site**, dating back to the 9th century, was initially dedicated to the Hindu god Shiva and later became an important pilgrimage site. Unlike other Khmer temples, Preah Vihear is unique in its layout, following a linear design that extends along a north-south axis rather than a central pyramid. The temple's architecture is both complex and majestic, with staircases, terraces, and intricate stone carvings that lead visitors through a spiritual journey to the central sanctuary. Its location on a cliff provides breathtaking panoramic views of the surrounding plains, adding to its allure.



Historically, **Preah Vihear** has been at the heart of a territorial dispute between Cambodia and Thailand due to its strategic and cultural significance. Although it was awarded to Cambodia by the **International Court of Justice** in **1962**, disputes over the surrounding area have continued, sometimes resulting in military tensions. Despite these challenges, Preah Vihear Temple has remained a symbol of Khmer heritage and resilience. It attracts visitors who appreciate its historical importance, stunning architecture, and remote setting. For those interested in exploring Cambodia's ancient history and sacred landscapes, Preah Vihear Temple offers an experience that is both culturally enriching and visually awe-inspiring.

# PONHEARY LY FOUNDATION

**Allow: 7 – 8hrs / Tour usually start from 06:00am**

Helping Feels Good! Visit one of our charity partner project travel two hours northwest of Siem Reap to visit a very remote village primary school supported by Ponheary Ly Foundation. Students here study the National Curriculum through grades 1 - 6. They have recently constructed a library and activity centre here which students can access outside of their classes. They also have recently installed a large water tank to assist with education in hygiene (washing hands and cleaning teeth) as there is no running water in this area or electricity, the school operates by solar. Here you will work alongside students and staff to prepare a meal and serve an all-you-can-eat lunch for the entire school. After the students have eaten and gone home, you will then have lunch at a local guest house before visiting the PLF Learning Centre based in the nearby Srayang, in operation since August 2020.



**PLF** expanded this learning centre model from others their to Srayang as the next evolution on from their former Srayang dormitory. Before this reinvention, only the top 25% of graduating 6th graders from Romchek and Koh Ker primary schools (where you visit in the morning) could access the secondary school at Srayang, by living at the dormitory. But now, they have huge trucks to transport students every morning from both these remote villages, meaning that for the very first time, all primary school graduates from these remote rural communities have the opportunity to attend secondary school. Students have their government curriculum at the public school (just across the road from the centre), then move across to the PLF Learning Centre to eat lunch provided by the centre before then finishing up their day joining the English Classes, Remedial Khmer and Mathematics classes, Computer classes, they also have access to a library, informal study groups, Life Skills Workshops and even a Chess Club.



Before 2020, Grade 12 did not exist in Srayang so every student seeking a high school diploma needed to do so in a larger urban centre, which was near impossible. PLF previously assisted the top students to move to their dormitories in Siem Reap to continue on with high school but spaces were limited. Now, though, students can remain living in this area with their families and study at the Srayang Learning Center through until Grade 12. In 2023, the first PLF Srayang students headed off to Phnom Penh and Siem Reap universities to embark on their degrees.
